As many will remember, AMA was successful in 2023 by securing a sanctioned event altitude waiver process for our events in Class G airspace, obtaining higher altitude authorization for many clubs in controlled airspace, successfully obtaining FAA-Recognized Identification Area (FRIA) status for AMA club sites around the country, and instating new legislative language in both the House and Senate FAA Reauthorization bills.

AMA appreciates all of the hard work and support that we have received from members of Congress, industry stakeholders, and those within the FAA who support model aviation. We know that there is still much work to be done, and AMA looks

forward to reducing restrictions on our hobby throughout 2024. Continuing work with Congress toward a final FAA Reauthorization bill, obtaining FRIA approvals for currently denied club flying sites, receiving higher altitude authorizations, and continuing to educate the FAA and policymakers, are just a few things on our agenda for 2024.

Most importantly, I would like to thank AMA members. Your support and leadership throughout 2023 have resulted in reducing some of the challenges that we are currently facing, and you have pointed us in a positive direction as we start the new year.
